THE EMPTY TOMB/THE RESURRECTON. MATT. 28:1-9

INTRO:

- The resurrection of Christ is mentioned at least 100X in the New Testament.
- Regarding the resurrection of Christ, we have the testimony of angels, those holy beings who cannot lie or deceive.
- We also have the testimony of holy men who have sealed their word with their own blood. Unwavering. In the face of death.
- Jesus showed Himself alive at least 9 times and to many women and men and once to a gathered crowd of over 500.
- The appearance of an angel, much like at the birth of Christ.
 - o To Zechariah, the Virgin Mary, joseph, the shepherds.
- The tomb was not opened for Jesus to get out, but for us to get in. (Rom. 6:3-5)
- As Christ spoke 7 sayings from the cross, so the angel speaks 7 sayings from its stone seat.
 - 1) Do not be afraid.
 - 2) You seek Jesus who was crucified.
 - 3) He is not here.
 - 4) He is risen.
 - 5) Come and see.
 - 6) Go quickly and tell His disciples He is risen.
 - 7) He will go before you to Galilee.

Read Matt. 28:1-9

<u>VS. 4-5</u> ⁴ And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.

- Notice how the same event produced two completely different reactions.
- The guards shook for fear of the earthquake and the angel, then collapsed with fear.
- While the women stood their ground un-fainting, hearing what the angel spoke to them.
- The verses says the angel answered, but there seems to be not asking of a question.
- It was an answer to their fear that the angel spoke comfort.
- Perhaps fear of what they just witnessed, perhaps a fear of the guards waking and arresting them, or killing them. Or afraid of what the tomb may reveal?
- To the guards it produced terror and shock.

- To the women comfort and faith.
- The earthquake and the angel are a response to Christ's resurrection, and so it is that His resurrection brings terror and collapse to His enemies and at the same time unspeakable comfort and joy to the believers.

<u>VS 5</u>: ⁵ But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.

- The angel points to Jesus being crucified.
- It is a crucified Savior we must seek. We have no other grounds of redemption than a crucified Lord.
- There is no way to the Father but through the door of the crucified Savior, not good works, not religion, but only a humble, contrite broken hearted total surrender and trust in the merits of our crucified Savior.
- Am I seeking Him? In salvation, in life? Every day.
- Seeking Him, not wealth, not fame, not success or ease, but to fellowship with the Crucified.
- The angel knew they were seeking Christ, do they know I am seeking Him. Does my life exhibit a continual seeking?
 - O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You In a dry and thirsty land Where there is no water.
- These women had nothing to fear for they were seeking Jesus.

<u>VS. 6:</u> ⁶ He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay

- He is not here, HE IS RISEN!
- This phrase "He is risen" is one word in the GK. (eg-I row), it suggest an active power of quickening principal, by which Christ raised Himself.
 - Acts 1:3 to whom He also <u>presented Himself</u> alive after His suffering
- It was His divine nature, the divine Godhead of Christ which revived and raised His manhood.
 - John 10:17, 18; "Therefore My Father loves Me, because I lay down My life that I may take it again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This command I have received from My Father."
- As He said: 12:40, 16:21, 17:23, 20:19
- Come see the place where the Lord lay.
- The angel is excited to invite them in to see what he has seen, an empty tomb.
- To see an empty resting place, grave clothes empty and the face napkin folded orderly on the stone?
- The grave had lost its Guest, death had lost its Prey.

WHY IS THE RESURRECTION IMPORTANT?

- Read 1 Cor. 15:1-8, 12-20
- The whole weight of our faith, hope and salvation hangs upon Christ risen from the dead.
- The crucifixion was a holy heavenly judicial trial.
- Had Jesus paid in full the just and legal price to appease the judgment of a holy God? Was His holy life, His sacrifice enough to pay the redeeming price?
- Not until the judge accepts the payment, approves the payment and pronounces the transaction "enough" can He set the captives free and pronounce the debt is paid.
- The proof, the answer from the Holy Judge was the resurrection.
- God Himself saying of Christ's sacrifice, "enough" the debt is paid and the holy substitute is released! His redeemed are released.
 - Rom. 4:25; who was delivered up because of our offenses, and was raised because of our justification.
- The resurrection was the proof of the Fathers acceptance.
- If Christ was not raised from the dead as He said He would, everything else He said was a lie.
- The bible would be just nice poetry and prose.
- The Old Testament prophecies of the Messiah's death are empty.
- Christ's resurrection is our own guaranty of a similar glorious resurrection. He is the first fruits.
 - 1 Cor. 15:20; But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have [a]fallen asleep.
- He is the first fruits of a whole harvest that will be raised. His resurrection is the guaranty of the whole crop.
 - Eph. 2:6, and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus,
- The resurrection declares Him with power to be the Son of God (Rom.1:4)
- The resurrection is the fulfillment of Jesus promise to us.
 - JN. 6:40, & 54; ⁴⁰ And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and <u>I will raise him up at the last day</u>."
 - 54 Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and <u>I</u>
 will raise him up at the last day.
- The resurrection of Christ secures all the other promises of the scripture to us.
 - For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God.

Conclusion:

- <u>VS: 8</u> : 8 So they went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word.
- For as the angel tells them, He is risen from the dead just as He said.
- He has also promised to return for us just as He said.
- Let us with reverence and awe go out from the tomb filled with "great joy" and live the message, let us bring the message.
